## From the Rector:

Dear Friends in Christ,

Each day, as we move toward NCPP #60, I grow increasingly aware of the truth within the scriptural theme of the weekend, "Surely, the Lord is in this place..." These words from Genesis 28:16 have spoken to me in so many ways and on different levels in the past several months as I have prayed about the team that would be called together and for the guests who would begin this journey through the weekend and into the Fourth Day. While Jacob uttered these words in awe at a specific place in the desert and so commemorated the spot with a stone, I believe that through the centuries we have come to understand that God is present at all times, in all places and to all people. # In Sponsoring Guests to NCPP— “I Consider Prayer as the Most Important Part of This”

## What motivates you to sponsor guests to the Pilgrimage and how do you go about it?

That was the question that we posed to several members of the NCPP’s 4th Day Community. Here are their responses:

### **Betty Ellsworth of Fayetteville:**

“An individual’s interest in the Lord, plus the Holy Spirit’s prompting, is what motivates me. I consider prayer as the most important part of this. I pray for them before I ask them and then I pray for them afterwards. I’m talking about a lot of prayer. Sometimes you have to pray for someone several years before you actually get them to go to the Pilgrimage. We are depending on the Lord in all of this.”

### **Jan Parker of Greensboro:**

“Sponsoring a guest for Pilgrimage is an incredible experience. I knew several people I wanted to ask to attend Pilgrimage immediately after my weekend. I quickly discovered that God calls guests for the weekend...not me! He will place the people who are ready to attend in my path. I simply have to keep my eyes and ears open to respond. I understand now why every weekend is so very special. God creates the “guests list” and attends to every detail. It is truly His weekend.”

### **Steve Wall of Greensboro:**

“I look to sponsor someone for Pilgrimage who I feel is on their journey. I consider Pilgrimage a spiritual “shot in the arm” to further prepare us for ministry and service. Most everyone comes away from the weekend spiritually charged and ready to jump into learning more and doing more for Christ. Most often, I extend a personal invitation even though we always open it to the church as a whole. A personal invitation with a small discussion of the weekend’s impact on my life sometimes leads someone to attend. It won’t happen though until God makes the path clear for the individual. When His time is right, they will attend. Then the sponsor gathers names of family

and friends to request letters which are so important.”

### **Lou Hodges of Greensboro:**

“I think the NCPP is an example of what we’re asking for in the Lord’s Prayer when we say, ‘Thy kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven.’ I make a list of committed Christians that I know and think will be blessed by the event and be a blessing to others. I pray for them, and I talk to them about NCPP and my experience, and tell them the dates for the next one, taking my cues from their responses. I don’t mention it to them again until about 6 weeks before the next one. I just tell them the dates and ask them if this is the time for them? I am committed to this program because I know personally that God changes lives through it and the people involved in it.”

### **Caroline Martin of Kernersville:**

“What motivates me to sponsor guests? I want to share God’s amazing grace and love with others and for them to know how much God truly loves them. How do I go about it? First, I ask God to make me open to hearing who God wants me to talk with about the Pilgrimage. I always have applications and dates ready to use. Sometimes you have to go back periodically and water the seeds you planted. They will go when God is ready for them to do so.”

### **Charles Monroe of Wagram:**

“A big part of my motivation is the love of the Pilgrimage community and the positive impact it has on its participants. How can you not want to share this special experience with those you love? That being said, God is at work in the leadership and direction of the activities surrounding the whole community. On each team and guest list are three additions which are obvious, the Father, son and Holy Spirit. Which

leads into how to go about inviting your best friend, one of the Sunday school teacher friends or close associates at work. You just ask them to spend a great weekend away with you on a retreat. I think I have worked every weekend I sponsored guests! I never launch into the total excitement of the experience. Hopefully, they see that in the way I live and the way I treat them and others...Do not overwhelm, just ask as you want to be asked. Ask them & they will come into His presence, with singing.”

### **Robin Mouzon of Germanton:**

“I am motivated to sponsor guests because of what I received from the Pilgrimage as a guest. I was able to let go of the burdens that were in my life in a loving and non-judgmental atmosphere. To be in a place where I could openly share my pain was very helpful to me. I truly believe the Pilgrimage is one of the resources that God uses to bring His children into a closer and strong relationship with Him. When in a conversation with friends and family and talking about God’s awesome characteristics, I end up telling them about the Pilgrimage and how it has helped me to grow in my Christian walk.”

### **Sheri Summerell of Kernersville:**

“I have found that my weekend speaks for itself when telling people about Pilgrimage. People have told me that they have seen a “change” in me (a good one—I hope!). I don’t set out trying to find people to sponsor...I look at myself as a “seed planter.” I tell them what the weekend has done for me and God always takes care of the rest. The important part is to tell them. Many times, someone else will sponsor that person. I never know how God used what I said to make them take that extra step and say ‘yes’ to a weekend.”

### **Todd & Gail Gaddy of Charlotte:**

“Our motivation to sponsor guests to the Pilgrimage comes from the fact that our weekend was a life changing experience. (continued to page 5)

strengthened us and helped us through some tough times in our lives and our church. And for that, we will be eternally grateful to our sponsors, Bill & Terry Gilmore. They loved us enough to not give up. Afterwards, we could not imagine how to re-pay them. Then, it became apparent that the gift came from God. He had taken us there, not our sponsors. But they heard God's call and listened. Because of that, a miracle happened. It changed our relationship with Jesus Christ and changed our lives. We now want all the people we love to have the same opportunity to experience God's love & grace as we did.

"When you hear God's call to sponsor a guest, take the example from our sponsors and listen. Discuss it with God and ask Him to guide you. Then the rest is easy. Just remember prayer and persistence. You ask God and then you ask them. As long as you continue to feel that nudge from God, you don't give up. You just might help a miracle to happen to someone you love."

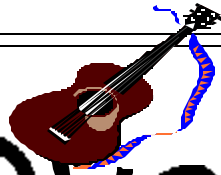

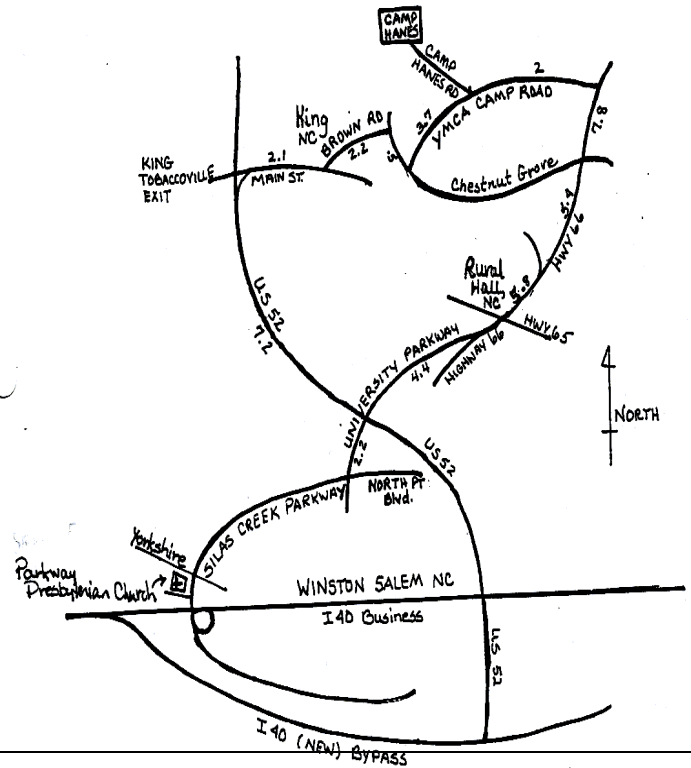
