From The **Piedmont Conference** By Russ Reighley, Moderator

Here's an update on the restructured Leadership Council

The Piedmont Conference sends greetings to all Pilgrims. Not all of you may be aware that the Leadership Council was restructured at the end of 2003. There is still a Leadership Council for the N. C. Presbyterian Pilgrimage, but we have modified the structure. There are now two conferences, Piedmont and Eastern, that manage our SIX (that's exciting in its own right) weekends per year. The Eastern Conference manages the March and November weekends at Camp Dixie. The Piedmont Conference is responsible for the February, May, and October weekends at Camp Hanes, plus the new September weekend in the western part of the state. (at Camp Dogwood near Lake Norman this year). I am blessed to be the moderator for the Piedmont Conference.

Each conference has all of the committee chairs that the Leadership Council used to have. The Leadership Council is now comprised of the chair, vice chair and treasurer, plus the moderators from each conference. The Leadership Council is primarily responsible to make sure each of the conferences "stay on track." Also the Leadership Council keeps NCPP connected to the National Council of Presbyterian 4th Day Movements. The changes were made for several reasons, but the most pressing one was our size. We have put on 57 weekends over the last 14 years with almost 2,000 guests. We have almost 200 guests per year. The weekends have grown in size from about 20 guests with a team of 30 to about double those numbers. GOD IS GOOD!

Slight change made toward improving Pilgrimages

During our meeting in late November of 2003, we discussed possible process improvements for the weekend. We had two areas of questions: the use of Spanish words and terms, and "covered" (hidden) team members at the tables. We decided to test the elimination of these for the February 2004 weekend. Our concern about the Spanish words/terms was that we were not sure that their English translations had the same meaning as their use on the weekend. Our concern about the "covered" professors was that over time we have received a few complaints that some guests felt a little "betrayed" because this "guest" was really a team member.

We had a conference leadership meeting in March to review the tests during the February weekend. As for the first test, elimination of Spanish words/terms, we decided it had virtually no impact on the Lord's work on the weekend. Therefore, we have dropped that test. In other words, we will continue to honor the Spanish heritage of the 4th Day movement with the use of Spanish words/terms, such as palanca chas, etc. As to the second test of eliminating the "covered" (hidden) team members at the tables, we still had team members at the tables, but they were introduced as "table facilitators" (team members) when the team was presented on Thursday evening. They were re-introduced as "table facilitators" when the tables were seated on Friday morning. By doing this, only the true guests introduced themselves as guests on Friday morning. One of the results of having the team member identified immediately at the table was that the tables "bonded" very quickly. The table facilitator who was a speaker was not introduced as a speaker, so that surprise continued. In the opinion of the conference leadership, not having "covered" (hidden) team members at

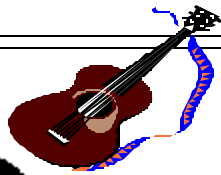

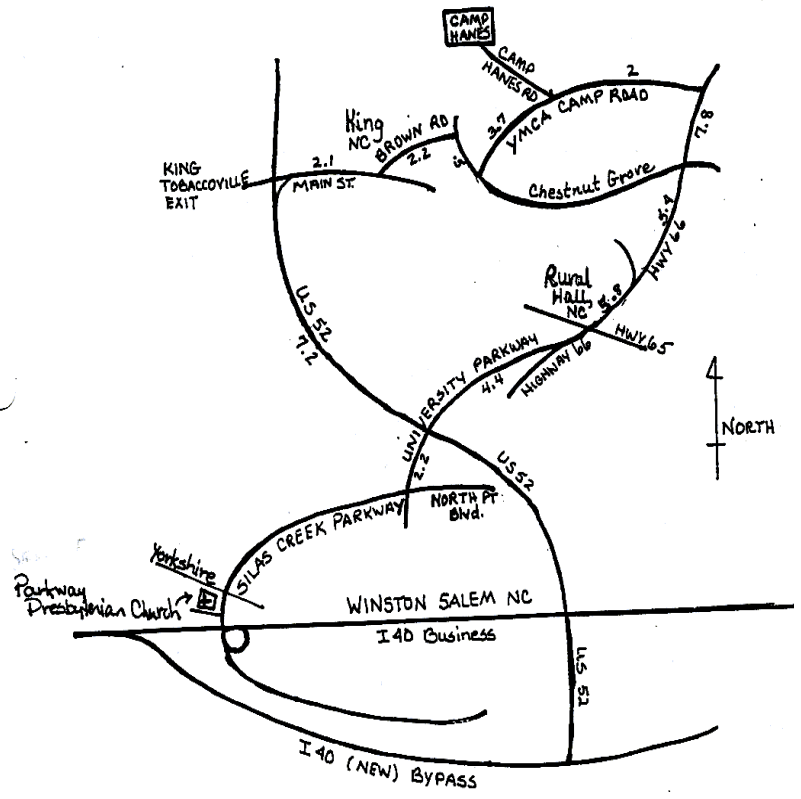
